50,000 Affordable Homes

London rents and house prices are the highest in the country. Many of those on low and middle incomes cannot afford to rent in London.

The Liberal Democrats have set out a plan to fund 50,000 new low rent homes.

The top up of £20 a year on our council tax for the Olympics, which Londoners started paying in 2006, ends in 2016.

The Lib Dems would keep the £20 a year levy in place and use the money to build more homes. This way 50,000 new homes, with all the transport, schools and facilities they need, could be built. These homes would be let out at a low rent to people who can't afford to buy their own homes.
