Prince Regent again under threat

A new planning application has been received to demolish the Prince Regent and erect a six storey block of 30 flats.

An application to build a six to eight storey block of flats on the site was rejected by the Council a year ago.

Although Historic England removed the Prince Regent from the national list of listed buildings, Sutton Council added it to its own local list last year.

Ward councillors have asked for the application to be decided by



the Planning Committee rather than by officers, so that local residents can have their say and

the committee can listen to their views.

Development of allotments site refused

The planning application to build on the former allotments site between Woodend and Greenhill has been refused.

Following objections from residents and ward councillors,

the application for a mixture of 5,4, and 3 bedroom houses has been rejected, as it 'would result in the unacceptable loss of Urban Green Space'.

Funding secured to make Collingwood Road safer

Following requests made by ward councillors, Sutton Council has allocated funding for important road safety schemes

in Collingwood Road and at the junction of Oakhill Road with the High St.
