Council listens to residents' views on parking

The results of the Council's consultation have now been published on their website, together with final proposals. Please go to our website below for links to these. The response to the consultation, as with many such exercises, has not been high, but our discussions with you on the doorstep, and your feedback to our leaflets, have enabled us to get a clearer idea of what you want.

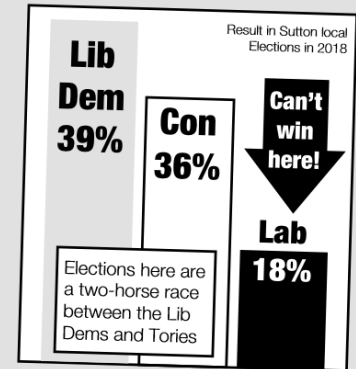
Having listened to your views we are proposing a residents' only Permit Parking Area (PPA) for Aultone Way, Woodend and Greenhill. A PPA is an area where parking is restricted to residents or visitors who have permits. The area is designated by signs at the junctions with Grennell Road, Rose Hill and All Saints Road, but there are generally no parking bays or yellow lines.

This means that residents can continue to park over their own driveways if they wish, and the scheme will not detract from the conservation area. It is proposed that the PPA will be from 8am to 6.30pm Mon to Sat, and will be enforced by parking wardens to ensure that those without parking permits cannot park. All within the area, whether they buy permits or not, will be entitled to 50 hours free visitors' parking permits. Full details of how a PPA works are on the Council's web site.

Kendal Gardens will be excluded from the scheme, at their request, as is Roseacre Close, as this is a private road, but Council officers are proposing that they should be able to buy permits.

In addition the Council is proposing double yellow lines around the two roundabouts in Aultone Way and at the entrance to Kendal Gardens, for road safety reasons; and also on the bend in Greenhill, and around the island junction of Greenhill and Woodend, to provide better access for emergency and refuse vehicles, etc.

The full proposals are on the Council website, and will be on display at Sutton Library on Thurs 27 June from 9am to 1pm and from 5pm to 8pm. Councillors and officers will be there to answer questions. The proposals are subject to a statutory Traffic Management Order consultation, which will be from 4 to 25 July when residents can have their final say on these proposals.
