

The NHS crisis comes after a
decade of mismanagement and

under-funding by the Conservative Government.

There are now serious concerns about the Conservative plan to cut St Helier's A&E department.

Cllr Ruth Dombey, Lib Dem Leader of Sutton Council said:

"I have experienced the crisis in our NHS first hand. Over Christmas I fell seriously ill and had to wait five and a half hours for an ambulance, then another 17 hours for a hospital bed.

"It is clear that after a decade of neglect by the Conservatives, our



NHS is on it's knees and now they are taking local services away when we need them most.

"It's not good enough. Lib Dems will continue to fight for our NHS and the investment it needs."
